

## White Anti-Racism in Post-Apartheid South Africa

ABSTRACT South Africans today live not only with the Gonory of the racial injustices of the past, but also with present injustices that injustices of the past, but also with present injustices that are a consequence of that past. How should white South Africans live was these past and present injustices? On recognition of the racial injustices of the past and of the continuation of forms of white privilege today involvement in ongoing antiracist struggles seems to be an appropriate by for white South Africans to respond to past and present injustices. However, some discussions of the way in which white privilege operates and its perpetuated in post-segregationist societies suggest the need for caution with regard to white involvement in antiracist struggles, arguing that some of the ways in which white people involve themselves in apparently anti-recest work actually result in the perpetuation rather than the erosion of white privilege. This article explores concerns about the intractability of white privilege while also ultimately defending the appropriateness of white involvement in anti-racist struggles.

## Introduction

Racial justice and racial equality have not yet been achieved in South Africa, nor indeed in the many other parts of the world which had at some time some form of explicitly segregationist white supremacist order. As Lucius Outlaw puts it, with reference to the United States, white supremacy may no longer be the 'reigning public philosophy', but the 'inertial racism of white predominance' continues
